

## **Holy Blossom Memorial Park (Brimley Road) COVID-19 Protocols for Interments and Unveilings**

Effective November 23, 2020, the gates of Holy Blossom Memorial Park (Brimley Road) will continue to be locked and will only be opened by our cemetery staff, and only to permit entry for scheduled graveside funerals during regular business hours, authorized unveilings scheduled through Holy Blossom, and for limited visiting hours, as set out in our Limited Opening Protocol. Our cemetery building will be closed to the public, including our public washroom.

*Grave visitations will be permitted Sundays and Thursdays, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.*

- 1. All individuals who are in self-quarantine due to exposure to COVID-19 are prohibited from attending graveside services and from entering onto the cemetery grounds. If the deceased has died or is suspected to have died from COVID-19 all individuals who had exposure to the deceased during the deceased's illness or within 14 days prior to death are prohibited from attending the graveside services and from entering onto cemetery grounds, unless they provide proof satisfactory to the Clergy, the Funeral Chapel staff and the cemetery staff that they have no quarantine obligations under all applicable laws, regulations, or government or other legislative COVID-19 protocols or directives. All steps permitted by law will be taken to enforce this prohibition, including the reporting of the incident to the police and other applicable authorities.**
2. All individuals who are in self-quarantine due to suspected exposure to COVID-19, and those who are in self-isolation due to recent travel, are also prohibited from attending graveside services and from entering onto cemetery grounds to protect the health of other mourners, Clergy, Funeral Chapel staff and cemetery staff.
3. We urge those who are older, have underlying health conditions or are feeling unwell not to attend graveside services.
4. The Ontario Government has now determined that the City of Toronto is in a Grey Zone for the purposes of its COVID-19 restrictions. This means the graveside funerals may be attended by up to 10 people, including clergy, but not including funeral or cemetery staff. Consequently, graveside funerals will continue be limited to **a maximum of 10 persons**. We are offering virtual funerals to better serve our members. Funeral Chapel staff must provide the cemetery with a list of 10 persons or less (including clergy) who will be attending the graveside funeral.
5. Individuals attending graveside funerals must remain in their vehicles until they are instructed by cemetery staff and/or Funeral Chapel staff. They also must sign a register and provide contact information should tracing of infection become necessary.
6. All individuals at the service must stand at least 6 feet away from the grave and maintain a physical/social distance of at least 6 feet apart from all persons other than members of their

immediate household, including other mourners, Clergy, Funeral Chapel staff, and cemetery staff. Funeral directors/assistants will direct families to create a physical/social distance at graveside of at least 6 feet from one another and will use best efforts to remind families during the service. At all times, visitors and Funeral Chapel staff must always remain at least 6 feet away from cemetery staff.

7. Only 2 shovels will be provided in order to enable the attending Clergy and one representative family member (please consult with your Clergy to determine who that should be according to Halacha) to throw dirt onto the casket. Once the top surface of only the casket is covered with a layer of dirt, attendees will be expected to complete the service and return to their vehicles and leave the cemetery, after which time, the cemetery staff will complete the filling of the grave. There is to be no passing of shovels. We are expecting that the total attendance time within the cemetery grounds for any graveside funeral will be 45 minutes.
8. All pallbearers must bring and wear gloves and anyone who handles the cemetery's shovels must also be wearing gloves. All gloves, masks, water bottles and other garbage must be deposited in the receptacles provided and must not be left anywhere else on cemetery grounds.
9. The Cemetery is now permitting unveilings. All unveilings must be scheduled through Lindsay Mockler at [lmockler@holyblossom.org](mailto:lmockler@holyblossom.org). Although best efforts will be made to accommodate the requested date and time of an unveiling, the date and timing will be totally within the discretion of Holy Blossom Temple. In accordance with the Province of Ontario's COVID-19 restrictions unveilings will be limited to not more than **10 people**. All unveilings must be completed within 30 minutes. All requirements set out in the Protocol concerning Visiting the Cemetery including the wearing of masks, the maintain of the required social/physical distance, and the signing of the Visitors Log must be complied with. Please note that funerals will take precedence.
10. As our washrooms are closed to mitigate risk of transmission, visitors should bring their own water for ritual hand washing after their visits. Visitors should remove any garbage they bring to the cemetery, including any water bottles, masks, etc.
