Face to Face Experiences:

- Progressive Judaism in Warsaw: Meet with Beit Polska and Ec Chajim and discover the heart of Jewish revival in Warsaw.
- Discussing the Past, Describing the Future: Meet non-Jewish Polish youth in the Forum for Dialogue and learn how
 they work to preserve their town's Jewish past and build a better future.
- Riding for Life: Take part in the Ride for the Living, biking the 55-mile journey from Auschwitz to Krakow. (optional)
- Shabbat of Celebration: Join over 500 cycling participants, the local Jewish community and guests world-wide for a celebratory Shabbat dinner, the largest in Krakow post-World War II.
- **Jewish Revival in Prague:** Meet with members of *Ec Chajim, Bejt Praha*, or *Bejt Simcha*, two of Prague's Progressive Jewish communities, and take inspiration from their dedication to revitalizing Judaism in the city.

Musical Experiences:

- Sing a Joyful Song: Enjoy the harmonious melodies of *Clil* (pronounced Tslil), the Warsaw and Lodz Jewish community choir! Sing along and learn new melodies as Poland's youth bring Judaism to life.
- The Greatest Jewish Show on Earth: Jump into the enlightening cultural and music scene of the Krakow Jewish Culture Festival, the largest in the world!
- A Fitting Celebration: Enjoy a festive dinner and farewell concert by the ACC, including greetings from the Israeli Ambassador and remarks from local Jewish community leaders.

Artistic Experiences:

- Via the Mezuzah: Join Mi Polin, the hip artist collab, for a pre-War tour of Jewish history in the Praga District.
- Tasting Kazmeirz: Delight in the Kazmeirz culinary scene on a tasting tour, enjoying delicacies such as perogie, zapikanka and other treats.

Jewish History:

- Professor of Knowledge, Doctor of History: Absorb the knowledge of the legendary Professor Stephen Berk who
 will help frame our days, giving us deep insight into the history and meaning of each city we visit.
- A Light in Dark Times: Witness the moving stories of heroism and martyrdom along the Warsaw Ghetto Memorial Route.
- **Standing as a Witness, Vowing "Never Again":** Visit the Auschwitz-Birkenau Concentration Camp for a difficult and emotional tour through the ultimate witness to Nazi barbarity and horror.
- Synagogues and Cemeteries: Discover the rich history of the former Jewish quarter of Kazmierz, including its famous synagogues and cemetery.
- History Preserved: Stroll through Josefov, Prague's former Jewish Quarter, and visit its famous synagogues and cemeteries, preserved by the Nazis as a museum to our destroyed culture.

Local Experiences:

- Salt of the Earth: Travel deep underground to the UNESCO Heritage Wieliczka Salt Mines for a tour of Europe's oldest working salt mine, filled with artifacts and sculpture.
- History Over a Pilsner: Discover Plzen and its Moorish Great Synagogue, the second-largest in all of Europe. Meet with
 locals, pay respects at the memorial to Jewish life lost and visit the city's famous Pilsner Brewery.



DAY 1, Sunday, June 26, 2022

DEPARTURE

We depart on our overnight flight to Poland.

DAY 2, Monday, June 27, 2022

ARRIVAL IN POLAND

- Arrivals throughout the day in Warsaw. Transfers will be provided for all arrivals on this day from the airport and central train station (transfer times TBD based on flight list).
- We set out on a **city tour of Warsaw,** including stops to view the **Royal Castle** and **Chopin's Monument** (tours will depart at 10:00 a.m., 12:00 p.m. and 2:00 p.m. to accommodate different arrival times).
- FACE TO FACE: Visit Beit Polska and Ec Chajim, two progressive institutions situated at the heart of Jewish revival
 in modern Warsaw. We will hear from Agata Rakowiecka, director of the JCC Warsaw— currently run entirely by
 women—to learn about the JCC's exciting programs including "Boker Tov" Sunday breakfasts that reignite and
 revitalize the connection to the Jewish community.
- ACC OPENING PROGRAM: We join for our opening ceremony and concert sing-along. Joining with the voices of the
 ACC and the local Jewish community is the Warsaw JCC's own choir, Clil, offering a window into the revitalization of
 Jewish life in Poland.
- We enjoy a welcome reception and dinner, catching up with old friends and making new acquaintances.
- Return to our hotel and enjoy the remainder of the evening at leisure to explore Warsaw.

Overnight in Warsaw

DAY 3, Tuesday, June 28, 2022

WARSAW'S JEWISH PAST

- Breakfast at our hotels.
- We hear from Prof. Stephen Berk who opens the day by placing our touring into historical context.
- We spend today engrossed in history through a Jewish Heritage Tour of Warsaw. Stops include: Entering the beautiful Nozyk Synagogue, the only surviving prewar synagogue in Warsaw; Walking the Memorial Route of Jewish Martyrdom and Struggle, including the Umschlagplatz Monument where Jews were assembled for deportation during the Holocaust, the horrific Stawski Street buildings where the SS was headquartered, and the Jewish Resistance Bunker at Mila 18 where the resistance fighters made their final stand; Viewing one of the few remaining fragments of the Warsaw Ghetto Wall. We also visit the Okopowa Street Jewish cemetery, one of the largest in the world.
- OR...RETURNEE TRACK: Join the artist collaboration Mi Polin for a moving tour through Warsaw's Praga District to
 discover the traces of pre-War Jewish history by following the outlines of mezuzahs that once adorned the doorways
 throughout the neighborhood.
- We take a docent-led tour of the astounding Museum of the History of Polish Jews (POLIN). The museum sits on the
 former site of the Warsaw Ghetto and features a multi-media narrative exhibition about the vibrant Jewish community
 that flourished in Poland for a thousand years.
- ACC PROGRAM: We host a memorial service at the dramatic Monument to the Ghetto Heroes, built by the Warsawborn Jewish sculptor Nathan Rappaport.
- Free evening to enjoy the Warsaw culinary scene (recommendations provided by our team or the host hotels for any free night).



DAY 4, Wednesday, June 29, 2022:

WARSAW TO KRAKOW

- Breakfast and check out of our hotel.
- We discover Warsaw's Old Town on a walking tour through the cobblestone alleys. See the medieval buildings
 reconstructed after World War II, explore the Old Town Market Square and view the Presidential Palace.
- FACE TO FACE: Participate in a special program with the Forum for Dialogue, a group working to strengthen
 connections between Jews and non-Jews in Poland. Led by local non-Jewish youth, we tour a nearby village to learn
 about its Jewish history and how its residents are working to preserve the past and forge a new direction for the
 future.
- We transfer to the Warsaw train station and board our train to Krakow (luggage will be transferred separately for our convenience).
- A boxed lunch is included today.
- Upon arrival in Krakow, we check into our hotel and have time to refresh.
- ACC PROGRAM: This evening, we hear the inspiring story of the rebirth of Jewish life in Krakow and the creation of the
 Krakow JCC as part of our discussion with Executive Director Jonathan Ornstein. ACC members will perform as part
 of this evening's opening ceremony for the Ride for the Living (Read more about the Ride at the end of this
 program).
- <u>CULINARY OPTION:</u> We return to Krakow and lift our spirits with a delicious culinary tour of the Kazmeirz Jewish
 Quarter, enjoying local delicacies such as *perogie*, *zapikanka* and other treats. (Separate cost)
 Overnight in Krakow

DAY 5, Thursday, June 30, 2022

MARKING DESTRUCTION, CELEBRATING REBIRTH

- Breakfast at our hotel.
- We travel to Auschwitz-Birkenau, the infamous Nazi concentration camp, using personal stories and texts as a guide.
 We begin our visit with a memorial service, followed by a visit to the museum. We participate in a guided walk through Birkenau with time for personal reflection, then join as a group at the end of the train tracks for a powerful memorial prayer.
- Lunch is included today.
- Prof. Berk concludes our day by placing our visit to the most infamous of Nazi concentration camps into its historical context.
- KRAKOW JEWISH CULTURE: This evening, choose to delight in Jewish music and culture at the unparalleled Krakow Jewish Culture Festival.

Overnight in Krakow

DAY 6, Friday, July 1, 2022:

JEWISH PRESENCE IN KRAKOW

- Breakfast at our hotel.
- PROGRAMMING OPTIONS:
 - Ride for the Living participants: We travel bright and early this morning to the Krakow JCC where we enjoy
 breakfast together before continuing by bus to Auschwitz to begin our inspiring 55-mile bicycle ride to Krakow!
 - Non-Riders: We take part in a Jewish heritage tour of Kazmierz, the old Jewish district, where we see the Old Synagogue, a massive fortress-like building erected in the 15th to 16th centuries, the Tempel Synagogue and the Ramuh Synagogue. We continue to Apteka pod Orlem, the Under the Eagle Pharmacy Museum inside the Jewish Ghetto and hear the story of Tadeusz Pankiewicz, recognized as a Righteous Among the Nations. We also pass by Oskar Schindler's Factory and the memorial at the former site of the Plaszow Concentration Camp.
- We return to our hotel for rest and to meet up with our counterparts.
- ACC PROGRAM: As the sun begins to set, we join together for candle lighting and Kabbalat Shabbat services with the local community, featuring the voices of the ACC.
- FACE TO FACE/KRAKOW JEWISH CULTURE: Later this evening, we enjoy an energetic and joyful Shabbat dinner
 together with over 500 cycling participants, including the local Jewish community and guests from around the world –
 the biggest Shabbat dinner in Krakow post-World War II.

DAY 7, Saturday, July 2, 2022

SHABBAT IN KRAKOW

- Breakfast at our hotel.
- ACC PROGRAM: Shabbat morning services will be led by members of the ACC.
- **PROGRAMMING OPTIONS:**
 - Ride participants: After breakfast at the hotel, take part in a Jewish heritage tour of Kazmierz, the old Jewish
 district, where we see the Old Synagogue, a massive fortress-like building erected in the 15th to 16th centuries,
 the Tempel Synagogue and the Ramuh Synagogue.
 - Optional morning tour: We travel outside the city center to explore the fun and fascinating UNESCO World
 Heritage Wieliczka Salt Mines, dating back 700 years. It is one of the largest and oldest working salt mines in
 Europe and is on the UNESCO list of the 12 most priceless monuments in the world. (Separate cost)
 - Optional free time for exploring Krakow on own, enjoy the amazing market square for a little souvenir shopping.
 - This afternoon, we enjoy a tour of Wawel Castle, St. Mary's Church and the Renaissance Cloth Hall, we
 continue down the Royal Way to the Krakow Market Square, the second largest square in the world, in
 Krakow's ancient city center.
- ACC PROGRAM: This evening, we join for Havdallah and a concert, celebrating the rebuilding of the Krakow Jewish
 community with music originating from Poland and Central Europe. We take part in the closing ceremony of the Ride
 for the Living and the Krakow Jewish Culture Festival.



DAY 8, Sunday, July 3, 2022:

WELCOME TO PRAGUE

- Breakfast at our hotels.
- This morning, we transfer to the airport for our flight to Prague, the Czech capital known as "the City of One Thousand Spires," filled with Baroque churches, promenades, parks and ancient city walls. Luggage will be sent overnight by truck directly to our hotels.
- Upon landing we enjoy a city tour, encompassing visits to the Hradcany Castle and the Charles Bridge, as well as the famous Astronomical Clock and St. Vitus' Cathedral.
- Delve into the stories and mind of **Franz Kafka** as we stroll along the **Golden Lane**, the quaint street that housed castle servants and served as a home to the famous author.
- Dinner on own tonight.
- <u>CULTURAL OPTION</u>: Attend a classical music concert at one of Prague's majestic concert halls (details & cost TBD).

Overnight in Prague

DAY 9, Monday, July 4, 2022

TEREZIN AND BEYOND

- Breakfast at our hotels.
- FACE TO FACE: Discover the fascinating background of Czech Jewry leading up to the Holocaust with a historical overview by Prof. Berk.
- Today, we travel to Terezin, the former "model" Nazi concentration camp. We visit the prison fortress, the hidden synagogue and the museum filled with the artwork of former prisoners. We stop by the memorial monument and pass through the town itself in addition to hearing stories and seeing photos of some of the rabbis imprisoned here, including Leo Baeck and Regina Jonas, the first woman ordained a rabbi.
- A boxed lunch is included today.
- OR...RETURNEE TRACK: Take a day-trip to Plzen and visit the Great Synagogue, the second largest synagogue in Europe. Built in the Moorish style, it stands as a testament to the once-great Jewish community in Plzen. We take part in a special program with the local community and visit the River Rock Memorial, created by a local school, that placed one rock for each Jew from Plzen. We end our day at the world-famous Pilsner Brewery before returning to Prague.
- Back in Prague, we enjoy an afternoon at leisure and dinner on own.

Overnight in Prague

DAY 10, Tuesday, July 5, 2022

JUDAISM IN PRAGUE

- Breakfast at our hotels.
- This morning, we tie together the historical loose ends with remarks by **Prof. Berk,** whose knowledge and insightful presentations have illuminated our journey.
- We tour the former Jewish Quarter known as *Josefov*, with its Old Town Hall, Spanish Synagogue, Alt-Neu Synagogue, Pinkas Synagogue, Maisel Synagogue, the Jewish cemetery, and the State Jewish Museum all standing witness as testament to the Jewish life the Nazis all but extinguished from the area.
- OR...RETURNEE TRACK: Visit Bejt Hagibor, the building that housed the Nazi headquarters during World War II, today
 meaningfully transformed into a Jewish seniors' home and kindergarten.
- FACE TO FACE: Meet David Maxa, the first Czech-born rabbi to return to Prague and founder of the local Congregation
 Ec Chajim OR (split group) meet with the leaders of *Bejt Simcha*, Prague's Progressive Jewish community, and take
 inspiration from their dedication and hard work to revitalize Judaism in this great city.
- Free time to refresh and relax, or do a bit of last minute shopping in this magical city.
- ACC PROGRAM: Tonight, we join for a festive farewell dinner, followed by a farewell concert by the ACC, including
 greetings from the Israeli Ambassador and remarks from leaders of the local Jewish community.

DAY 11, Wednesday, July 6, 2022

ABOUT PROF. STEPHEN BERK:

Prof. Stephen M. Berk is a Professor of History at Union College in Schenectady, New York, Chair of the Department of History, Director of the Program in Comparative Communist Studies and Faculty Advisor to the Jewish Student Organization. He is author of Year of Crisis, Year of Hope: Russian Jewry and the Pogroms of 1881-1882 (Greenwood Press, 1985). At the present time Professor Berk is writing a book entitled, Our People Are Your People: American Jewry and the Struggle for Civil Rights 1854-1965. The book provides an interesting discussion of an extremely important chapter in the history of the civil rights movement and attempts to dispel the myths and misunderstandings that surround the Black-Jewish relationship. Professor Berk is also the author of many



articles on Russian History, Russian Jewish History, anti-Semitism and American Policy in the Middle East. Professor Berk is frequently consulted by newspaper reporters and by television and radio stations including the BBC. He has lectured in numerous universities in countless cities and towns in the United States and Israel and is a primary speaker for the UJA, Israel Bonds and B'nai B'rith. Professor Berk is considered an absolutely superb lecturer and teacher. Touring with him has been compared to attending a "traveling university...his lectures are outstanding." He is always informative, interesting and entertaining. He has lectured as scholar-in-residence for Ayelet Tours on many trips to Russia, Spain, the Caribbean, Eastern Europe, Europe and Israel.
