



BUILDING WITH JEWISH VALUES

RABBINIC REFLECTION



I write to you, dear congregants, when our Torah is scrolled to the words, "Make for Me a sanctuary and I will dwell among them" (Exodus 25:8). The first communal building project in Jewish history was The Mishkan, the portable sanctuary we carried with us throughout our desert wanderings. It was placed at the centre of the people; all the tribes were stationed around it in concentric circles. The Mishkan was the meeting place where the Israelites drew nearer to God's Presence and to one another. It is in this spirit that we are now building our renewed Holy Blossom Temple.

The structures and their contents will be exquisite, but more importantly, they will be expressions of our congregational values. Glass and steel, wood and stone, will reinforce what matters most to us. For example, we'll walk on Jerusalem stone and be reminded of Rabbi Nachman of Bratzlav's proverb: "Wherever I walk, I am walking toward Jerusalem." We'll breathe the clean air, oxygenated by our Green Wall and LEEDS certification, to be reminded of Genesis' command "to guard and protect" the earth. We'll easily navigate our way with the help of ramps and railings; our furniture and washrooms are designed to be fully accessible. Lighting and sound are increased, so we fulfill the Levitical mitzvot: "Do not offend people with hearing-impairment nor place a stumbling block before people with vision-impairment."

Our Leadership Centre will stand for Holy Blossom's commitment to compassionate and courageous Jewish leadership. Our Youth Lounge, prominently placed, stands for our commitment to the coming generations. Our Library stands for our commitment to lifelong learning. Our Life Cycle Room stands for our commitment to families at every age and stage. There are two unique features which also speak to our congregational values.

Our Living Museum*

In our Plan on a Page, we commit: "To honour our past and boldly prepare for our future."

As Toronto's first synagogue, Holy Blossom Temple has many stories to tell. We often speak of our history and the leading figures who brought greatness and goodness to our congregation and beyond. There will be a number of places dedicated to sharing the treasures from our archives. In addition, we have designated one display case for a "Living Museum," where congregants can, in rotation, share their family stories. I often hear such stories when I visit a shiva home, a beautiful ketubah, which belonged to her European grandparents, a black and white photograph of Eleanor Roosevelt hosted by Temple Sisterhood in his parents' living room, a little prayer book inscribed by Rabbi Eisendrath before his father went off to war. Families will prepare an accompanying card to tell the story of each treasured heirloom. In this way, we honour our shared history.

Our Tzedakah Centre*

In our Statement of Identity, we say:

"Holy Blossom has fulfilled religious and civic duties by being at the forefront of

major social justice issues, both within Canada and outside of its borders.... We encourage all who join us to continue our work in mending the world (Tikkun Olam)."

Within our Atrium there will be a Tzedakah Centre, a one-of-a-kind piece of furniture in the shape of Holy Blossom Temple. (NB: The image is the architectural rendering of it). Each "wing" of the Tzedakah Centre will contain a series of drawers of varying sizes. Each drawer will be labeled with the name of the congregant, or team of congregants, who are collecting something specific for someone specific. For example, a Bar/ Bat Mitzvah student may be collecting gently used sports equipment or children's books for the less fortunate. Our Green Committee may collect used electronics and batteries for proper recycling. A physician may collect used eyeglasses to bring to a far-off community in need. Out of the Cold leadership may call for new socks or winter boots. On a rotating basis, congregants will have a chance to invite the generosity of fellow congregants. And in the middle of our Tzedakah Centre will be a tall tzedakah box in the shape of Jacob's Tower.

Our Docents*

We'd like a team of docents to give tours when Phase I is complete. Docents could be trained by our architects, our archivists, and our rabbis to share our congregational stories and demonstrate how our Temple is built by our congregational values.

"Make for Me a sanctuary and I will dwell among them" (Exodus 25:8). We are bringing these ancient words to life again, right here at 1950 Bathurst Street. How fortunate we are!

Holy Blossom Temple, the first Reform Temple in Toronto and among the largest congregations in North America, has an international reputation because of our acclaimed clergy, our innovative educational and social justice programming and the strength, support and commitment of our membership. Our reputation will be even further enhanced when the renewed space is revealed.

WELCOME TO HOLY BLOSSOM'S LIGHT-FILLED LIVING ROOM

The living room is really the heart of a home. It's comfort. It's where we sit down and take a moment with a cup of coffee. Or connect with family and friends to chat, discuss issues of the day, and often, celebrate. Typically, it's the central hub around which other spaces in our homes are built. Our new Central Atrium at Holy Blossom has been conceived to be all of that and more.

If you've been an avid follower of our Renewal communications (for the last decade or so!) you know that we've talked in the broadest terms of our Atrium connecting all aspects of Temple life ... from prayer in our main sanctuary, to learning in our school wing, to simchas in our congregational hall. And you've seen the gorgeous architectural renderings that give you a good sense of the visual appeal of the space.

But as we rapidly approach completion of Phase 1 construction, and our planned opening sometime this summer, we thought this would be a perfect time to take a more detailed walk through all that our new, light-filled Atrium will offer us at Temple. So come on in with us through the main Ava Road doors. There's much to see and do ...

First, you'll want to make a beeline to our **Holy Grounds Café**. Imagine, getting an excellent cuppa joe at Temple! Or a fair-trade cappuccino or latte. Or choose from a selection of herbal teas. Details are still brewing, but Holy Grounds will be an intimate and warm place where

you can grab a drink and then find a comfortable space to sit down in our Library or Atrium ... to do a bit of work, talk with friends or just sit and grab a bit of valuable quiet time.

We want you to spend as much time as you'd like in your Temple living room. And yes, we know that finding a comfortable perch was a difficult proposition in the old Holy Blossom. To that end, our **new sofas and chairs in the Atrium** will be both durable and comfortable for all ages – Little Blossoms to seniors. They'll also provide a perfect vantage point to contemplate our ...

... **new living wall**, climbing high up the west-side of the Atrium. The whole of our new campus will be environmentally-friendly with a LEED Silver certification, but the living wall, in particular, brings a visible, sustainable and healthy vibe to our Atrium and is also a wonderful teaching tool for the little ones.

From there, take a few short steps over to our **new Judaica Shop**, and say hello to one of our friendly Sisterhood volunteers behind the counter. Beyond the shop itself, we plan to have all of the gorgeous items displayed in full-colour on our website, and we're actively looking into an on-line shopping experience, as well. As always, all proceeds from our Judaica Shop go to Sisterhood to support Temple activities.

Now, stroll a little southward from the shop and you'll find the private and comfortable **Life Cycle Room** where you can have an intimate discussion with our Rabbis or other clergy prior to your family events.

Next, continue along towards the Main Sanctuary. What you'll see is a

stunning entrance hallway, featuring 12 wood panels, each with a carving of one of the Tribes of Israel.

From the first floor, climb the winding staircase (or take the elevator) to the Atrium's 2nd level. Cast your eyes skyward again, through the glass ceiling as you make your way toward our new Family Chapel. Designed to be multi-purpose with seating that can be configured for different needs, our Family Chapel is a soulful, welcoming space where we can gather for prayer, simchas, concerts or other community events.

There's also **quiet gallery space** on the second floor where you can grab a comfortable seat and admire rotating art displays, as well as a large curved display case that will house our rare Scrolls of the Prophets.

And of course, it almost goes without saying that all our new and reimagined Renewal spaces will be fully accessible, built to the latest AODA guidelines.

So, hopefully with the help of this

little walk-thru, we've whet your appetite and you can begin to sense how our Central Atrium - our Temple living room - will change how we experience not only all that we offer at Holy Blossom, but also how we connect with one another. And there are still so many exciting details to come. As with any space in a new home, there is also a lot that we do not yet know about living there. We'll learn from using it day to day, and continually work to improve the experience based on those learnings.

One thing is certain about our Atrium though, even as we see it taking shape at this early stage: Life can blossom here.

CORNERSTONE DEDICATION REMARKS

First night of Chanukah, December 12, 2017

Hello, I'm Tom Friedland, Chair of our Renewal Project Steering Committee. On behalf of the Renewal Project Steering and Building Committees, welcome and Happy Chanukah!

As you may have noticed from your time at Temple (or from our biweekly updates in Life at Holy Blossom or from our two live-streaming cameras that I know you all watch every day), there's still a little bit of construction work left to finish off Phase 1! Nevertheless, we are very excited (and, indeed, proud and honoured) to be here on this first night of Chanukah to mark an important milestone: the dedication of the cornerstone for our new space.

This moment in time has been reached through the hard work and dedication of so many people, including:

- Our generous donors this year alone we have raised over \$5 million in new gifts as our momentum brings us ever closer to achieving our Phase 1 fundraising goals. Indeed, as you've heard, "Aleinu: It is upon Us" with everyone contributing aspirationally, each according to her or his means, dare we dream of completing our fundraising before construction is finished this summer?
- Our ever-patient clergy and Temple staff, who, among their many talents, have kept the Temple fully operational throughout construction
- Our tremendously supportive ward Councillor, Joe Mihevo
- Our incredibly tolerant and supportive neighbours sorry about the little bit of extra noise, dust and traffic!
- Our outside professional partners at Diamond Schmitt Architects (represented this evening by Duncan Higgins), Alliance7 (our Owner's Representative, Aaron Bruno) and Pomerleau Construction
- Every single member of HBT, past present and future as Rabbi Splansky says: "A congregation that is capable of undertaking such an enormous endeavour - the largest ever Canadian synagogue building project - is surely a congregation worth belonging to."
- Our many super-dedicated lay volunteers in the areas of construction, fundraising, communications, engagement, transition, financial controls and many other areas – we've only been at this for a couple of decades now – I'm sure everyone is eagerly looking forward to starting Phase 2 construction soon enough!
- And representing these many, many lay and professional leaders are the following members of our Steering and Building Committees:
 - Cary Solomon, Chair of our Building Committee since his early 20s - even before I became involved!

- Joan Garson, the Temple's immediate Past President and Chair of our Fundraising Committee
- Judy Winberg, our newly-elected Temple President and leader of our Transition Committee
- Mark Anshan, also a Temple Past President and a member-at-large of our Steering Committee
- Jonathan King, a dedicated member of our Building Committee, working closely with Cary, Aaron and Duncan every week
- Russ Joseph, our Temple's Executive Director and our key (and tireless) professional support
- David Rosenberg, Chair of our Communications Committee, who, unfortunately is not able to be here tonight
- and, of course, Rabbi Splansky, who aside from her important role in our "Renewal of Space" is the undisputed leader and driver of our companion "Renewal of Spirit" - we need both Renewal of Space and Renewal of Spirit for life at Temple to fully "blossom"

So, just before we do the grand reveal, there are a few ways that you will need to use your imagination when you see the cornerstone. First, this is a dedication ceremony, not the actual laying of our cornerstone, which in due course (and certainly before our formal ribbon cutting ceremony) will be installed in front of the new Ava Road entrance to our campus – and not here in the Main Sanctuary!

And, second, the engraving will be filled in with bronze pin lettering to make it more visible. As a consequence, you may not be able to see the words clearly from where you are sitting – please come up to the bimah after the concert for a closer view.

As a preview, the words on the cornerstone - in both Hebrew and English - reflect the evolution of our campus over time, from generation to generation:

- from 1938 the building of our Beit Tefillah this beautiful sanctuary - our House of Prayer
- to 1960 the construction of our Beit Midrash the School Wing our House of Learning
- to 2018- the opening of our Beit Knesset our House of Gathering, featuring our light-filled Atrium - the Temple's new living roomconnecting all aspects of our congregational life, including both Prayer and Learning

And so, without any further ado....

For Michael Bregman, giving to Renewal, just makes sense

For Michael Bregman, longtime congregant and well-known leader in business and philanthropy, Holy Blossom's historic Renewal Campaign could not have come soon enough.

"I'm proud to be a member of Holy Blossom Temple," says Michael, who is currently the president and CEO of Tailwind Capital, an investment firm focused on publicly-traded companies, "We very much wanted to give our children a liberal Jewish education. Holy Blossom was the right place for us and remains the right place for me today."

As the decades passed, Michael and his growing family celebrated many happy milestones within Holy Blossom, including the *Bnei* Mitzvot of his four children. The family also attended regularly at the High Holy Days and other lewish celebrations.

However, while Holy Blossom's services and programs were enlightening and inspiring, Michael could not help but notice an increasing deterioration of the Temple's physical facilities.

In Michael's opinion, the state of the building was not keeping pace with the beauty and majesty of that which occurred within Temple's walls.

"Holy Blossom is an icon," says Michael. "But the old building had become dilapidated and was anything but iconic. Early on, I spoke up for the need for a major renovation. So when Renewal was announced, I felt very much motivated to make a major gift. I had the means to do so and felt lucky to be in a position to help."

For Michael, membership at Holy Blossom is about much more than belonging to a prestigious Congregation with an international reputation of excellence. For him, participation at Holy Blossom is an individual and spiritual matter, something that provides him with enrichment and pleasure.

"Synagogue is not something I am obligated to attend," says Michael. "Participation is completely my choice, and when I attend, I do so with a sense of pride at being part of the traditions. I go to High Holiday services, usually with some of my children, and it's something I look forward to each year. I may not appear at Temple very often, but when I am there, it's because I want to be there."

In addition to participating as a donor, Michael also serves on the Renewal Project Campaign Cabinet, a group of Temple leaders who are devoted to completing the Phase 1 fundraising Campaign.

"I get many requests to serve the community," says Michael. "I turn most of them down because of practical limitations. But Holy Blossom is important to me and the future of the Congregation is important to me. I want to see this community thrive for generations to come. I felt this effort was something I wanted to join."

To date, Renewal has raised over \$27 million of our Phase 1 \$31.5 million goal.




We look forward to welcoming you to our new Library in the coming months!


Our new atrium will contain spaces designed to display many articles important to the history of Holy Blossom throughout its 160 years of existence.


